# Constitution Changes

As suggested by the Committee

Clause 2(a)2 - Addition

Senior members with special needs can shoot but need to be accompanied by a guardian or someone who is prepared to take responsibility for that member present when shooting. The Committee reserves the right to allow any Senior with special needs to shoot unaccompanied if they feel that the person is capable of shooting without supervision.

Clause 2(b) paragraph 2 - Change

The Committee shall have the power to expel from the Club or refuse to renew membership of any member who commits a gross breach of the safety regulations or who persists in objectionable conduct, bringing the Club into disrepute, or any action that the committee unanimously considers unacceptable.

- Clause 7(e) Change
- A written record of the proceedings of all general and committee meetings will be produced and signed by the current chairman and kept for three years or until such time as their disposal shall be agreed at an A.G.M.
- Clause 7(f) Addition
- Emails received by the Club Secretary shall be retained electronically by the Club Secretary. These will only be shared within the committee if necessary. Once any required action is complete all copies of emails should be deleted except the original which will be retained by the club secretary.

- Clause 8 Change
- **8**. Insurance
- All archers must be covered for Public Liability Insurance during shooting, by affiliation to the Archery GB

Rounds, Handicaps, Classifications

#### Introduction

- Under normal circumstances the Archer does not need to understand the underlying mechanics
- The Club Records Officer manages this
- Anne Fretwell is the Club Records Officer
- The classification and handicap systems are designed to give the Archer something to strive for.
- If you achieve the Bowman classification you may be asked to shoot for your county

#### Definitions

- Round A Number of arrows shot in one session at single or multiple distances
- Handicap a value that can be used in a handicap competition to allow scoring of the competition between different age groups, bow types and rounds. The Handicap value is derived on past performance
- Classification a designation based on the scores obtained in the round shot during a season
- Allowance a number to be added to a score in a handicap competition based on the handicap of the Archer

#### Rounds

- Imperial (9 zone scoring)
  - ► Warwick's 4 Dozen @ 2 distances
  - National's 6 Dozen @ 2 distances
  - Western's 8 Dozen @ 2 distances
  - Bristol's 12 Dozen @ 3 distances
  - Windsor's 9 Dozen @ 3 distances
  - American 7.5 Dozen @ 3 distances
  - St Nicolas 7 Dozen @ 2 distances

- Metric (10 zone scoring)
  - Metric's 12 Dozen @ 4 distances with change of face
  - Long Metric's 6 Dozen @ 2 distances
  - Short Metric's 6 Dozen @ 2 distances on small face
  - ► WA's Multiple Rounds

#### Rounds - Imperial Naming patterns

#### Imperial Rounds follow a pattern

- New starts at 100 yards
- Long starts at 80 yards
- "standard" starts at 60 yards
  - E.g. Western
- Short starts at 50 yards
- Junior starts at 40 yards
- Short Junior starts at 30 yards

- Exceptions to the pattern
  - Bristol Rounds are numbered i,ii,iii,iv,v staring at 80 Yards
  - York a Bristol type round starting at 100 yards
  - Hereford a Bristol type round starting at 80 yards
  - St George a Windsor type round starting at 100 yards
  - Albion a Windsor type round starting at 80 yards

### Metric Rounds - naming patterns

- Metric Rounds follow a pattern
  - I starts at 70 metres
  - ► II starts at 60 metres
  - III starts at 50 metres
  - IV starts at 40 metres
  - V starts at 30 metres

- Exceptions to the pattern
  - Rounds designated (Gents) start at 90 metres
  - Rounds designated (Ladies) start at 70 metres
  - There are some special rounds
    - ► FITA 900
    - FITA 70m
    - ► FITA 60m
    - FITA Standard
    - Olympic Round
- Please note:
  - Ladies and Gents rounds can be shot by anyone

## Handicaps

- Every possible score for every round has a handicap allocated to it
- When you have shot your first three rounds your handicap is calculated by averaging the three scores
- Each subsequent score will then adjust this handicap if it is better than the last.
  - Example
  - First three scores give handicaps of 74,75,45
    - ► Your 1<sup>st</sup> handicap will be 194/3 = 64
  - Each subsequent score will then adjust this handicap if it is better than the last three. Next score gives handicap of 52
    - Your new handicap will be 74+52+45/3 = 57

## Classifications

- Adult Classifications
  - ► 3<sup>rd</sup> Class
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Class
  - ► 1<sup>st</sup> Class
  - Bowman
  - Master Bowman
  - Grand Master Bowman

- Junior Classifications
  - ► 3<sup>rd</sup> Class
  - ► 2<sup>nd</sup> Class
  - ► 1<sup>st</sup> Class
  - Junior Bowman
  - Junior Master Bowman

- Getting a Classification
  - If you shoot three rounds whose scores are equal or higher than the class then you will receive a badge
  - If you get to Bowman Class an entry will be made in the AGB magazine and your score will be sent in a Monthly report to KAA
  - Master Bowman, Junior Master Bowman and Grand Master Bowman classification can only be achieved at a record status shoot and are administered directly by AGB

## Special Awards

- Six Gold End Open to all archers this can be gained by shooting a 6 gold end at the top two distance for your age group
- Three Gold End Open to longbow archers this can be gained by shooting a 3 gold end at the top two distance for your age group
- Tassel Awards These are awarded at some Clout Shoots
- Rose Awards These are awarded at Rose Award Outdoor Archery Competitions

## Club, County and UK records

- Club Records are reviewed and managed by Anne our records officer.
- County Records have to be claimed through Kent Archery Association
  - ▶ A pristine scoresheet must be signed by a club official and sent to KAA for verification
  - Scoresheets that have mistakes not signed by a judge or field captain will not be verified
  - Claims must be sent quickly as there is a time limit for claims
- ▶ UK Records have to be claimed through Kent Archery Association
  - ▶ UK Records can only be claimed at a UK Records Status Shoot
  - ▶ A pristine scoresheet must be signed by a Judge and sent to KAA for verification
  - Scoresheets that have mistakes not signed by a judge or field captain will not be verified
  - Claims must be sent quickly as there is a time limit for claims
